


me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

tionately known, has faithfully served as Christ Church's associate rector since August 2011.

"Christ Church, the city of Savannah and the entire Episcopal Church have been immeasurably blessed with Sierra's ministry," said our rector Michael S. White. "She joined our parish after graduating from Harvard Divinity School and was soon ordained a dea-



con and then a priest. She has been an exemplary and humble servant to the poor and those in need and is committed to proclaiming by word and deed the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

Later this month, the Reyes family will be moving to Denver, Colorado where Rudy will begin studies for a Ph.D. in Religious Studies and serve as a teaching assistant at the University of Denver's Iliff School of Theology.

The Rev. Sierra noted, "God called me to Christ Church six years ago, and my family and I are forever grateful. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we now begin a

new journey but our hearts will always be with this community of faithful people at Christ Church."

Before entering seminary, Sierra grew up on Tybee Island with her mother and younger sister. She also served as an acolyte for many years at All Saint's,



Tybee. She is a cum laude graduate of Agnes Scott College, was the president of the student body for Harvard Divinity School and was the youth representative to the committee which elected Katharine Jefferts Schori as the Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal

Church. She also studied with Archbishop Desmond Tutu at the University of Cape Towne in South Africa.

Sierra was ordained to the sacred order of priests at Christ Church by the Rt. Rev. Scott Anson Benhase on February 18, 2012. She and Rudy were married at Christ Church on April 13, 2013 and Julia Mae was born on September 8, 2016. In addition to her responsibilities at Christ Church, Sierra also currently serves on the Commission on Ministry for the Diocese of Georgia and on the Board of Directors for Chatham Savannah Citizen Advocacy. Working under the leadership of our rector, Sierra's primary responsibilities have been in the areas of youth ministry, religious education and congregational life. Through their collective efforts, we have seen Christ Church develop into one of the fastest growing and most dynamic churches in the Episcopal Church.

Thank you Sierra, Rudy and Julia Mae for being gifts among us and we pray that the Lord bless you and keep you; that the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; and that the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace; though Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
