First Lesson

Micah 6:1-8

Hear what the Lord says:

Rise, plead your case before the mountains, and let the hills hear your voice.

Hear, you mountains, the controversy of the Lord, and you enduring foundations of the earth; for the Lord has a controversy with his people,

and he will contend with Israel.

"O my people, what have I done to you?

In what have I wearied you? Answer me!

For I brought you up from the land of Egypt,

and redeemed you from the house of slavery;

and I sent before you Moses,

Aaron, and Miriam.

O my people, remember now what King Balak of Moab devised, what Balaam son of Beor answered him, and what happened from Shittim to Gilgal, that you may know the saving acts of the Lord."

"With what shall I come before the Lord,
and bow myself before God on high?

Shall I come before him with burnt-offerings,
with calves a year old?

Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams,
with tens of thousands of rivers of oil?

Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression,
the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"

but to do justice, and to love kindness,

Epistle

1 Corinthians 1:18-31

The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wis-

dom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For



Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose

what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

She graduated from Stetson University with a degree in music and a minor in education, and then returned to Haiti where for the past ten years she has been working as a teacher of math and music – a most intriguing combination! – and a humanitarian. She was drawn to the Episcopal Church in Haiti through her participation in its choir and music programs.

She has been provisionally hired as the 7th grade math teacher at Hesse Ele-

mentary. Christ Church will continue to be her musical home though she is also looking forward to working with the Savannah Children's Choir.

Jamie sings in the Alto section of our choir and is a frequent soloist. Tim Hall praises her wide range and says, "Jamie is beloved by her fellow choristers. Her arrival has brought a renewed energy to our group."

How did you come to Christ Church? "My brother teaches English at Armstrong so when I was ready to leave Haiti I came to stay with him in Savannah.

The Director of Music at Trinity Cathedral in Miami suggested Christ Church would have an excellent music program. I came, I met Tim Hall and here I am."

What's one of your treasured Christ Church moments? "Every moment has been a positive moment but Sunday, December 11th stands out. It was the day I was to sing my first solo but the week leading up to it




was terribly stressful – I got sick and lost my voice and family friend in Haiti was kidnapped. I got well enough to sing and then that morning I found out our friend had been safely released. Standing there singing that first solo, healthy and relieved, was a poignant moment for me."
